Celluloid Bainbridge Film Festival:

Bainbridge Island's own regional film festival returns for its 19th edition November 4th and 5th

BAINBRIDGE ISLAND – Presented by Arts & Humanities Bainbridge, the Celluloid Bainbridge Film Festival is an annual two-day event that showcases films and filmmakers from Bainbridge Island and the greater Pacific Northwest. Films are screened at the historic Lynwood Theatre. For seventeen years, Celluloid showed only films made on Bainbridge Island or by island filmmakers. In 2016, the festival expanded its reach to the rest of the Pacific Northwest. This year, Celluloid Bainbridge will once again offer festivalgoers a smorgasbord of quality films both homegrown and from across our great region.

The weekend kicks off Saturday November 4th at 5pm with an Opening Night Reception at The Manor House, offering attendees the chance to mix with visiting filmmakers and industry professionals while enjoying fine food and drink. After the reception, Celluloid heads across the street for the 7pm screening of the festival's featured films: "The United Guys Network," a comedy short by Vancouver, BC director Tabatha Golat, "The Story of Bainbridge Island" a film tour of the island in times gone by produced by the Rotary Club of Bainbridge Island in 1960, and "Another Man's Treasure," a documentary film about the Rotary Auction directed by the island's own Steve Stolee. Saturday's festivities are followed by a full day of screenings from 9am to 9pm on Sunday November 4th.

VIP Tickets include admission to the Opening Night Reception and all film screenings and are \$50; tickets to Saturday and Sunday screenings are \$15; tickets to Sunday screenings are \$10; and student admission is \$8.
